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The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children® (NCMEC) Community Education Partner program aims to exponentially expand the reach of critical prevention education to youth, parents/caregivers, and the professionals who serve them.

NCMEC implements national, regional, and local partnerships with like-minded organizations to support the delivery of high-quality and impactful programs, including partnerships to increase the reach of NCMEC's prevention education resources.

Partner organizations include schools, child welfare and law enforcement agencies, as well as established community-based and child-serving nonprofit organizations that have been providing services for at least one year. NCMEC provides Authorized Facilitator Training, presentation request referrals, and ongoing support.

Community Education Partners commit to delivering NCMEC prevention education presentations and resources to youth and adults in their local community. The partnership is formalized with a signed Community Education Partner Agreement.

AUTHORIZED FACILITATORS

Community Education Partner staff members who successfully complete all components of NCMEC's Community Education Partner Training will be recognized as Authorized Facilitators. Authorized Facilitators will deliver NCMEC prevention education presentations and resources within their community and leverage their knowledge to address unique community challenges. Our resources provide engaging, age-appropriate tools to build safety skills and community capacity to protect children, and include group presentations, classroom activities, tip sheets, videos, games, and discussion guides.

3 Facilitator Training

- ✓ Participate in Authorized Facilitator Training
- ✓ Access NCMEC education presentations and resources
- ✓ Completes observation delivery with NCMEC

4 Early Implementation

- ✓ Report implementation data and program evaluation to NCMEC
- ✓ Technical assistance provided by NCMEC

5 Ongoing Implementation

- ✓ Implement NCMEC prevention education programs in local community
- ✓ Participates in program evaluation and provides feedback for program improvement
- ✓ Referrals, updated resources and impact reports provided by NCMEC
